By ensuring the rights of women and girls across all the SDG goals, we will achieve justice and inclusion, economies that work for all, and sustaining our shared environment now and for future generations.



SDG Goal 1: Zero Hunger

Globally, nearly 1 in 3 women experienced moderate or severe food insecurity in 2021



SDG Goal4: Quality Education

54% of GIRLS who are not in formal education worldwide live in crisis affected countries

SDG Goal 5: Gender Equality

Seven years left to achieve gender equality and empowerment of all women and girls, the world is not on track.

Progress on gender equality has been slowly due to the intersecting crises of COVID-19, the climate emergency, rising economic and political insecurity.

Added by a growing backlash against women's rights



Long and Winding Road to Gender Equality

At the current rate of progress, it may take another 286 years to remove discriminatory laws and close prevailing gaps in legal protections for women and girls.

Violence Against Women and Girls

1 in 10 of women and girls aged 15-49, more than 1 in 10 (12.5%) were subjected to sexual and/or physical violence by an intimate partner in 2021.





Child Marriage

Child marriage is a global issue. It is fuelled by gender inequality, poverty, social norms and insecurity, and has devastating consequences all over the world.

To end child marriage by 2030, progress must be 17 times faster than it was over the last decade.



GENDER BUDGET

Despite progress, only 26% of UN Member Countris have a comprehensive system to track gender budget allocations

SDG Goal 6: Clean Water & Sanitation

The lack of clean water claims the lives of more than 800,000 women and girls every year.

Clean water & sanitation problems affect reproductive health of women and girls



SDG Goal 7: Affordable and Clean Energy



Millions of women and girls in Asia and Sub-Saharan Afrika do not have access to affordable and clean energy, which serves as one of keys to lifesaving care and productivity

SDG Goal 8: Decent Work & Economic Growth

Limited protection for women who are casual workers in various industries and those who work in informal sector



SDG Goal 9: Industry and Innovation



Globally, women hold only 2 in every 10 jobs related to science, engineering, information and communication technology

SDG Goal 10: Reduced Inequalities

By the end of 2021, some 44 million women and girls of different social groups had been forced to flee their homes due to climate change, war, conflict and human rights violations



Goal 11: Sustainable Cities & Communities



Almost 50 % of women in urban areas feel less safe walking alone at night since COVID-19 began.

SDG Goal 12, 13, 14, 15: Environmental Sustainability

- Increasing forms of ecological disasters
- Women, especially from poor and marginalized communities, are disproportionately affected.



SDG Goal 17: Partnership for the Goals
